

What is the Order of the Eastern Star?

The Order of the Eastern Star is the largest fraternal organization in the world to which

both women and men may belong. Members are comprised of men who are Master Masons, as were many of our country's great leaders—George Washington, Harry Truman, Francis Scott Key, Henry Ford, and not to forget—Buffalo Bill Cody! Women in the organization must have a specific relationship to a Master Mason, such as being the wife, daughter, granddaughter, mother, widow, or sister of a Master Mason. Eastern Star is, however, a completely separate organization from the Masonic Lodge, though we often meet in the same building.

Our organization is not a religion. Our teachings are sometimes referred to as "Secret"; however, the lessons taught within our meetings are based on heroines whose stories are told in the Bible. As members we try to exemplify the noble principles and high moral conduct which the stories of those heroines portray.

In Nebraska there are 80 Chapters of the Order of the Eastern Star in communities across the state, and currently there are over 7,000 members. Each year these members contribute thousands of dollars and devote hours of volunteer services to worthy projects. This scholarship program is just one of those projects. Again this year Nebraska Eastern Star members will give scholarships to high school seniors across the state. Members support activities within their own community as well as projects promoted by the state body, the Grand Chapter of Nebraska, and the General Grand Chapter, the body which oversees Chapters all over the world. Nebraska members support the Masonic-Eastern Star Home for Children located in Fremont Nebraska and we assist with many projects of the Nebraska Masonic Lodge including The Nebraska Masonic Home in Plattsmouth, the Masonic All-Star Marching Band Clinic, the CHIP Program (Child Identification Program) and Service Dogs. Each year a "Special Project" is also selected to receive our support. Some of these projects have included Noah's Assistance Dogs in Crete Nebraska, the Juvenile Diabetes Association, and Make-a-Wish Foundation of Nebraska, Salvation Army, Alzheimer's Research, Multiple Sclerosis, Red Cross, Diabetes education Center of the Midlands and Rite Care and this year Wounded Warriors Family Support. We also support Job's Daughters, Rainbow for Girls and DeMolay for Boys, youth groups which are a part of our own "Masonic Family".
