During this summer's visitations, local chapter officers will be given a form to take to their chapters for use in making decisions on "Going for the Goals."

Members are asked to talk over what changes they'd like to see accomplished in their chapters. Suggestions voiced so far include shorter meetings, more meaningful meetings, more social activities, more public contact, and even suggestions for getting air conditioning in the chapter rooms. Goals are to be listed on the forms brought home from the visitations, and each chapter is to lay out a road-map or plan to achieve their individual goals.

Later this year, a Grand Chapter officer is to visit the chapter and discuss with members how they are going about reaching their goals,

with an eye to sharing the ideas with other chapters seeking to achieve results and perhaps offering assistance.

Chapters goal should reflect:

- More of something
- Better than something,

or

- Less of something.

Think about it. Perhaps the goal should be MORE interaction with the community in order to get Eastern Star in the minds of the public.

Perhaps it should be BETTER attendance at meetings. Or perhaps it should be LESS time wasted in dull, uninteresting sessions.

When setting goals, members are asked to think *SMART*; a goal should be:

- S...Specific*
- M...Measurable*
- A...Attainable*
- R...Relevant, and*
- T...Trackable*

Proficiency Challenge

This is an entirely voluntary program. If you choose to challenge yourself to fulfill the requirements below, you will receive a very nice pin as soon as the paper work is completed.

You must memorize a lecture from our ritual, say it to your own Worthy Patron, and complete a short open-book quiz which may cover some ritual work, the law book and/or the instruction book. If you are an officer, you may choose to recite your part or another part to qualify for this award. You may participate even if you are not a chapter officer.

Your Worthy Patron will receive instructions about the various lectures you may learn and the procedure for submitting your name, address and the part you chose to recite. This information will be sent to Past Grand Matron, Sister Bonnie Evans, a member of the 2004-2005 Advisory Committee. Sister Bonnie will let the Worthy Grand Matron know of your qualification to receive the "Proficiency Award" pin immediately. Your Chapter will receive the forms and details by September 1. Be the first one in your chapter to qualify.
