Scholarships –2007-2008 academic year----

The Board of Grand Trustees <u>recentl</u>y approved several changes to the Grand Chapter Scholarship Program: 1.) The policy now allows either the Chapter or the school to select the recipient. 2.) Funds given by the Grand Chapter have been increased to \$175 for the first scholarship and \$125 for the second scholarship making the minimum amount of the scholarship \$200. Hi Clarence and Clara,

We miss you and are looking forward to your returning in a few months. I'm glad to hear that you enjoyed hearing about our General Grand Chapter Assembly. The members of the General Grand Chapter are progressive and many resolutions were presented and discussed. Only a few of those changes affect us here Nebraska, but I thought I should let you know about them:

- 1. A resolution was passed that defines a "regular lodge of Master Masons" as "a lodge recognized by the Grand Lodge wherein the chapter petitioned is located. A common source is the List of Lodges Masonic issued by the Grand Lodge. This List is supported by the Conference of the Grand Masters of North America.
- 2. The official name of the International Eastern Star Temple has been changed to "International Eastern Star Headquarters".
- 3. Grand Honors may now be given to recipients of 50-year or longer pins only at the time of the presentation of the pin.

It is exciting for us here in Nebraska to be starting another New Year.

Q: How do I get in? If I arrive at a meeting late, what must I do to get into the meeting correctly?

A: It's simple! If the Sentinel knows you (can vouche for you) she/he will rap on the door at the proper time. (She/He may have to wait until a ritual ceremony is completed or until the Pledge of Allegence has been given to the flag.) Once the Worthy Matron knows that you are properly vouched for, she will ask the Warder to admit you. When the door is opened for you to enter you should use square corners to go directly behind Esther's chair, face the East and give the "Salutation Sign". (Remember how your hands were when you held the Bible at the Altar?—hold them just like that at waist level—and give a slight bow.) Wait for the response from the Worthy Matron (described in the Secret Work!), then you may be seated (square corners look nice here too!)—and enjoy the meeting.
