Public Relations

PR plays a very important role in membership development. Communication and PR can be considered one and the same.

One story in the local newspaper or a public service announcement on a local radio or TV station does not constitute a complete PR program.

OES chapters unconsciously undertake PR programs of one kind or another to improve their image or create a positive image that the public understands and respects.

A famous business man, Pitney Bowes's philosophy is that "If you are doing things today the same way they were done ten to twenty years ago, they probably are being done the wrong way."

The community needs to know the Masonic family and what we stand for and most importantly how to join. By creating wider knowledge about Masonry and the Order of the Eastern Star, the more appealing we become and substantially improve the joining process.

Meet with a local reporter to let them know what OES is doing and listen to their advice. Develop a hand out and have it widely distributed in the community.

What you consider news and what the media considers news are usually far apart. Understand their needs as far as readership and advertising are concerned, adapt and listen to what advice they have on how to make your chapter and its special events newsworthy. Doing something for the community that is a positive on continuous basis will greatly enhance your chances of being recognized. In Nebraska, our cooperation with the CHIP events fit that category. The child identification program has struck a note nationwide and Masonry is at the forefront. By helping, we can be there too!

"Do not follow where the path may lead—go instead where there is no path and leave a trail."



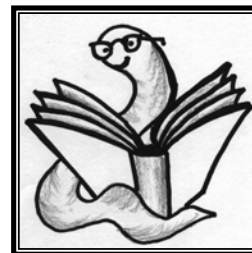
