Joe Gordon, an excellent ball player and good hitter, followed Doby that day and proceeded to strike out on three straight pitches. He went to the dugout and sat next to Doby and put his head in his hands.

Did Gordon strike out intentionally? No one knows, but it is interesting to note that every time Larry Doby went out on the field from that day on, he first picked up Gordon’s glove and tossed it to him. “That’s family” - that’s caring that someone else succeeds.

It is also interesting to note that Doby was the first African American to play on an American League team in 1947. Jackie Robinson was already playing in the National League.

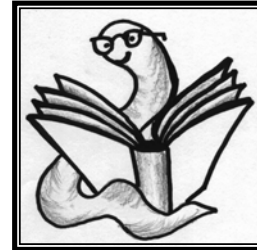
Invitation
