## IRS Reminder~~~

Chapters—don’t forget the new requirements for electronic filing of the “e-Postcard” (Form 990-N) You will need to file for the 2007 year after December 31<sup>st</sup> and before May 15<sup>th</sup>. If you do not have your EIN number call the Grand Chapter office and they will look it up for you—you will need this number when you go online to file. Your Chapter’s tax exempt status now depends upon your filing this form annually, so it is important.
