Dr John C. Maxwell makes six key observations about enacting change and when you need to change.

- Most people change just enough to get away from their problems not solving them. In OES implementing an aggressive membership program is a change desperately needed.
- Changing your organization (OES) requires changing yourself; “People do what people see”. Changing yourself into a recruiter and sales person for the Order of the Eastern Star encourages Sisters and Brothers to do what they see.
- “People tend to do the same thing the same way and expect change to take place.” That philosophy does not work! Pitney Bowes explains that if you do the same thing the same way over ten to twenty years, it’s being done the wrong way. We cannot expect to attract and hold new and old members without change.
- “Change when you see the light, not when you feel the heat.” The loss of members, Chapters closing or consolidating--that is the heat - now is the time to see the light and make changes to beat the heat.
- “Change is uncomfortable; it’s unsettling and sometimes downright painful.” In the long run, the thought of the loss of your Chapter is far worse.
- Change if properly done is helpful not harmful to a Chapter. It fosters and enhances the Visionquest criteria of membership, leadership, involvement, communication, enthusiasm and fellowship.
