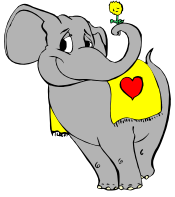
If the goal is firmly believed in, it compels completion. If unsuccessful at first - try, try again. Remember Sisters and Brothers
