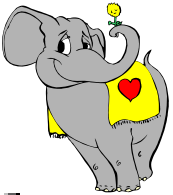
FROM YOUR GRAND CHAPTER MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The Grand Chapter Membership Committee is asking each Chapter to appoint a Membership Committee. Larger Chapters may wish to have a committee of three, but at the minimum we would like at least one member of each Chapter that we can contact and work with—we want to get to know our Chapters and visit one on one with local Membership Committees. Worthy Matron-elect please appoint a member or members from your Chapter and see that the name is listed on the “Membership Challenge” Form that your Chapter Secretary will be returning to the Grand Chapter office in January. Let’s work together to think of ways to increase membership and participation.

Reminders -----

- 1) The Annual Reports were mailed to the Chapters in November. Don’t forget that they are due back in the Grand Chapter office by January 15, 2009. Remember, you do not need a vote of the Chapter to disburse your check for per capita dues, as that amount is specified in the Grand Chapter Bylaws (Section 97, pg 49), but if you prefer to make a motion for the payment, be sure to do it in December so as not to delay your report, which must be accompanied by the per capita funds.
- 2) Don’t forget to tally up your results for the “Membership Challenge” and return that to the Grand Chapter office with your Annual Reports.
- 3) Many Chapters suspend for non-payment of dues as of December 31st. You may still have time to make a personal contact with those members and encourage them to pay—or at least to request a Demit. We work so hard to get new members; we should work equally hard to *keep* them.

It seems that the community of Schuyler has a “Parade of Christmas Trees” each year with different organizations decorating trees for the holiday.
