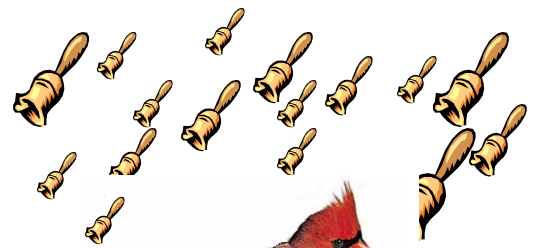

In the speech I present to the Chapters during my "Visionquest" visits, there is one passage exhorting Chapter members to give a speech or presentation to a Masonic lodge or another Masonic family organization.

Tony Leary, "Mr. Presentation", relates some interesting and informative tidbits on giving presentations.

Being credible, effective and truthful are crucial in successful presentations. Get rid of the "know it all" approach. You do not need to have all the answers. "Being too slick can break the emotional connection between you and your audience."

"Know the difference between being effective vs. being right." To be an effective facilitator you need to treat people fairly and equally and patiently lead the group to a solution.

The self-righteous facilitator gets involved in being right and dictates a position even if not appropriate to the process. If things do not go well, the self-righteous individual does not have results, but excuses, "I've done what I can. It's not my fault if they didn't get it."

Be able to laugh at yourself if you make mistakes. It's humanizing and helps establish you as a real person.

Adapt your language to the group you are addressing. Stand up straight, be confident and smile, maintain eye contact. These tips are a good way to build a good rapport with your audience.

The benefits you will reap include - You will earn the trust and respect of your audience; the group will be able to relate to you as a human being and the audience is more likely to "buy into the message you are trying to convey".

PROJECT FUNDS

This is to explain some confusion about our Project Funds. Each year two new funds are established:

---THE WGM/WGP PROJECTS will support all of the charities our presiding officers have chosen. This year that includes our two homes, ESTARL, Youth Groups and the General Grand Chapter Projects. At the end of the year the total in this fund is disbursed to these charities according to the wishes of the WGM and WGP. Money for this fund typically comes from the Chapter gifts given at Area Visitations (including sales table proceeds) and funds you designate for the "WGM and/or WGP's Projects".

---The Special Project -this year that will be THE SALVATION ARMY. All funds designated for "Salvation Army" go into this fund (including the sale of bells for "Billie & Bruce's Bell Choir") and the total will be disbursed to this charity. The WGM and WGP may also designate that a portion of the money collected in their "projects" fund be transferred to this fund in support of their "special" project. Please use the designation "Salvation Army" when you wish to contribute specifically to this fund.

GRAINS FROM THE PAST

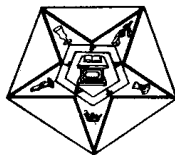
Our Grand Chapter Proceedings Books carry a wonderful history of our Order. To help us toward this year’s goal of “Preserving our Past” we will be sharing with you notes from past copies of our Annual Proceedings Books. We hope you will join us in preserving our past this year by reading these “Grains from the Past” at your stated meetings.

June 23, 1875: Resolutions were made that Subordinate Chapters be requested to advance annual dues of twenty-five cents for each member; that the Grand Secretary be instructed to notify each Chapter in the State of the formation of this Grand Chapter and that she “request their acknowledged allegiance and recognition” to this Grand Chapter. There were a total of nine Chapters present when the first “Constitution and General Regulations” of the Order of the Eastern Star of the State of Nebraska were adopted.

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Nebraska Eastern Star,

We are writing this letter to you on behalf of our Worthy Grand Matron, Billie Mattern and Worthy Grand Patron, Bruce Raddatz. We have had the honor of being asked to serve as Co-Chairmen of their statewide Salvation Army Project. Cathy Voshell is a member of Fontenelle Chapter #249, Omaha and Laurel Wolfe is a dual member of Electa Chapter #8, Lincoln and Trinity Chapter #299, Omaha.

The Salvation Army has been known for years to assist those in need from either natural disasters or personal disasters. The Salvation Army is located across our beautiful State. In doing our research, we found that there were only 9 Chapters who did not have a Salvation Army branch in their town and if there wasn't they were approximately 60 miles away from a branch.

There are many ways that you will be able to help the Salvation Army this year. In the Omaha area since 1998, the Salvation Army and a local TV station have sponsored "Help Kids Back-To-School Backpack Program". The backpacks are stuffed with new school supplies to insure that less fortunate children can go back to school with confidence. This year the drive will be from June 29 thru August 12. You can collect your backpacks and school supplies and send them to either Cathy or Laurel to deliver to the Salvation Army, or check with your local offices of the Salvation Army and offer to help the children in your communities get ready to head back to school.

Other things that your Chapter can do to help is collect canned food for the food banks of the Salvation Army; collect toys for a toy drive; and of course, ring those bells during the Christmas season. Be sure and check with your local Salvation Army and let them know that Nebraska Eastern Star is there to help them in whatever way you can.

There are other ways to help raise money for the Salvation Army. A portion of the profits from the purchase of items sold on the sales table at the Area Visitations will be directed to the Salvation Army Project, so please shop at the sales table when it is in your area. Billie and Bruce are also encouraging every member to purchase "A BELL" for \$1 or donate \$1 so that at their Session in May of 2010 you can be a member of the BELL Choir.
