### What is in your Membership Tool Box?



*Let's add a Community Service Event.*

Think about our Grand Chapter projects, your Worthy Matron and Patron's projects, the projects of our Youth Organizations. Maybe your Chapter would like to sponsor a project to help an organization in your community, a food bank, military servicemen, a retirement center or a homeless shelter.

Think about inviting other Masonic organizations to join you with sponsoring the event.

Think about doing the event out in your community. Instead of getting people to come to our Masonic Centers, move outside your “comfort level” and go out to the people.

Discuss whether or not you would like Chapter members dressed in shirts that identify the organization.

Once you have selected your Community Service Event, ask for help from the community. Include non – members as workers at your event. Give them the opportunity to see who we are and what we do by role-modeling and including them. Many people like to volunteer and get involved.

Advertise for workers to help in church bulletins, newspapers, websites, the organization you are serving, etc.

During that “refreshment and fellowship” time you will, of course have some information about your chapter to give to the non-member volunteers. You may even ask for contact information from the non-member volunteers, so you can contact them about future events, send invitations to other open chapter events, maybe a complimentary ticket to a fundraiser, etc.

*Grains from the Past Preserving the Past; Preparing for the future*— Having just concluded Nebraska's School of Instruction, I thought it might be interesting to visit one of our past years when Eastern Star was at its height in membership, so I just chose a proceedings book from the 50's—1957. In preparation for the supervision of the 44,408 members of the 262 Chapters in Nebraska, Supervisors were divided into 26 districts. Each Sister supervised ten or more Chapters. In 1956 a revision had been made to the Book of Instruction. Worthy Grand Matron Lorene Peterson gave her loving thanks for "the long hard hours of labor given so unselfishly by the Supervisors..." While our numbers are now much smaller, we continue to have dedicated District Grand Supervisors who do spend long hard hours preparing to instruct the Chapters assigned to them and I hope you join me in extending my thanks and appreciation to all of them—and I'm praying for good weather and "joyful noises" at Chapter schools across the state in the coming months.
