(Remember if you receive any complimentary tickets: if you already have the ticket—*don't list it on your form*; if you need the ticket, indicate that it is "Comp" in the amount column and order it. **The Deadline for pre-registration is April 24, 2010.**
4. **Don't forget: Credentials—Dues Receipts—Past Matron or Past Patron Card—Past Grand Matron, Past Grand Patron Certificates.**
5. **Don't forget your cookies**—if you are a Past or Present Grand Representative or a member of PAGOS. Our whole family is looking forward to those cookies!
6. **Send in your resume** right away if you are interested in being considered for the election of a new Grand Secretary.
7. **Participate in the Proficiency Challenge**—just have all your installed officers and all new members initiated in 2009 complete the proficiency test, record it in your Chapter's minutes and mail their names to the Grand Secretary by April 25th!
8. **Bring your baskets, craft or other item to participate in the Silent Auction/Raffle.** See the enclosed flyer.

Here are the comparisons:

Membership close of 1989: 23,569; Membership close of 2009: 9,149

Number of Initiations 1989: 244; Number Initiations in 2009: 118

Net loss of members 1989: 1,059; Net loss of members 2009: 398

Number of Chapters consolidated 1989: 5; Number of Chapters consolidated 2009: 5

Number of Chapters Jan 1, 1990: 175; Number of Chapters Jan 1, 2010: 100
