Sisters & Brothers it is hard to believe that it is November already and that Grand Chapter will be here before we know it. I have been asked by Sister Jerrie Wilcox to be the Chairperson for the Auction and Raffle Committee for Grand Chapter May 10th, 11th and 12th, 2011. The monies we raise will go to ESTARL. In preparation for this, I would like to ask you/your Chapter to consider donating: 1) A basket or item that could be used for silent auction tables. 20 Items that can be used for the “immediate” sales tables, e.g. but not limited to handmade crafts (crochet, knit, needlepoint, wood, metal, etc.), food items (jams, jellies, peanut brittle, etc.). The silent auction items should be delivered to Grand Chapter at Pershing Auditorium on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, May 8th, 9th or 10th. The items for the “immediate” sales tables can be given to me at any time or at Grand Chapter. Please price these items. I would greatly appreciate it if you could let me know if you will be having something to donate and the approximate space it will take so that I can arrange for the appropriate number of tables. Thank you in advance for being my “angels” to help make this project a huge success!

Benevolence Committee

To understand the purpose of the Benevolence Committee, it is useful to review some basic principles on which we, as Star members, form our relationships. In the history of Dr. Rob Morris, it is said that he was “generous, tender of heart and loving in disposition.” The Master Builder of the Order of the Eastern Star was “happiest when sharing with others that which the Lord has bestowed upon him.” Our brother Masons are reminded, “To relief the distressed is a duty incumbent on all men; but, particularly on Masons....” Many Masonic organizations have an “Almoner's Fund.” Its use is for the relief of the needy and distressed. The funds are often distributed without any publicity,

as not to embarrass the recipient. The Benevolence Committee as established under Grand Chapter By-Laws for just such a charitable purpose. The intent of the Benevolence Committee is to recommend one-time financial assistance as may be requested by a member of the Order and/or a family member who may be in need. For example, it would be appropriate to request assistance in procuring a ramp so that a wheelchair-bound member would be able to leave the confines of his/her home. However, living expenses for a member without any source of income for the foreseeable future would require long-term financial assistance and would be, therefore, beyond the scope of the Benevolence Committee. Any member of the Order (and especially Grand Officers) who receives a request or becomes aware of a member who is in need of a one-time assistance, should immediately forward the request to the Benevolence Committee or to the Grand Secretary who can forward the request to the Benevolence Committee Chairman. The full Committee will make a recommendation for relief to the Board of Grand Trustees, who will have final approval.

In summary, the intent of the Benevolence Committee is to recommend financial assistance with the following limitations: 1. The assistance is limited to members of the Order and/or family members. (Proof of such a relationship is needed). 2. The assistance is limited to short-term (usually one-time) needs. (Details concerning the need and possible projected costs are needed). 3. The Committee's recommendation is limited to a maximum amount of \$3,000.00 for any single request. Bernie Hauber, Benevolence Committee Chairman 2010-2011.
