This is a reminder that the Grand Trustees have purchased an insurance policy that will provide coverage to all subordinate chapters to a limit of \$10,000 with a \$500 deductible, which will be the responsibility of the chapter suffering the loss. This coverage will be provided to all chapter's at no cost and will cover misappropriation of funds by a subordinate chapter's Secretary or Treasurer. For any chapters that have assets in excess of the \$10,000 limit of the policy, the chapter will be solely responsible for purchasing appropriate additional coverage.

As we get ready to settle into winter, let your thoughts wander towards spring and the Membership Committee's Garden Project. We hope to help you Sow the Seeds of Membership with the following ideas. **Step 1:** On a packet of seeds, attach a business-size card. On one side of the card, have a little information about the Order of the Eastern Star. Here's an example from the "Gift of Membership" information you can obtain from Grand Chapter. *The Order of the Eastern Star is an international fraternal order comprised of women and men with religious convictions and high spiritual and moral values. Its appeal rests in the beauty of the character-building lessons that are sincerely portrayed in its ritualistic work.* On the other side make sure to include contact information. **Step 2:** Now that you have your seed packets, find fertile ground and plant the seed. Give these to people you know aren't in Star. There are two ways to do this, and both can be effective. One is to scatter the seeds. Pass them out at parades, fairs, church bazaars, any place you can think of. Not all will take root. But many will. The other way is to take care where you plan them. Keep track of who you are giving the packets to. This way will be more effective and will take a little more time. But in the end, it will be worth it. **Step 3:**

Tend your plants. They have your contact info. And if you haven't heard back from them in a week or two, then reach out. Give them a call and see if they have questions. Make a plan to meet to talk more. Nurture this sprout of membership to help it grow. **Step 4:** Gather in the harvest. Be ready with a petition and to help get it completed and turned in to the Secretary. Don't trust your harvest to chance, make sure to follow up. If each Star member would sow just one seed, imagine how our garden would grow!
