EDUCATIONAL LOAN

The educational loans of the Grand Chapter of Nebraska are available to members and family members of members.

A brochure is included in this notebook.

- The application for and Educational Loan must be submitted annually for funds to be awarded.
- The applicant must be 18 years old or a high school graduate and have a 2.0 grade average to apply.
- The complete application must include: (1)completed application form, (2) the applicant's most recent official transcript of grades, and (3) one signed letter of recommendation presented by a school official or a community leader.
- A copy of each of these items will be sent to the members of the Educational Loan Committee who will hold them in the strictest confidence.
- Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- Applicants will be notified of approved loans by July 1st.
- Funds will be disbursed to the student.

SCHOLARSHIPS

★ Each year our Scholarship Committee of Nebraska Grand Chapter accepts applications from our Masonic Youth groups' membership and then awards a \$1000 scholarship to each of the Masonic Youth groups of Nebraska for a graduating senior.

★ Our chapters individually may award scholarships to graduating high school seniors. The scholarship is to be a minimum of a \$500 award. Each Chapter must contribute \$50 to the scholarship with Grand Chapter contributing \$450.

 \star A chapter may award a scholarship with an amount greater than the \$500 minimum or they may award additional scholarships.

★The name of the recipient of the scholarship and your chapter's \$50 contribution must be in the Grand Chapter Office no later than May 1, 2021.
